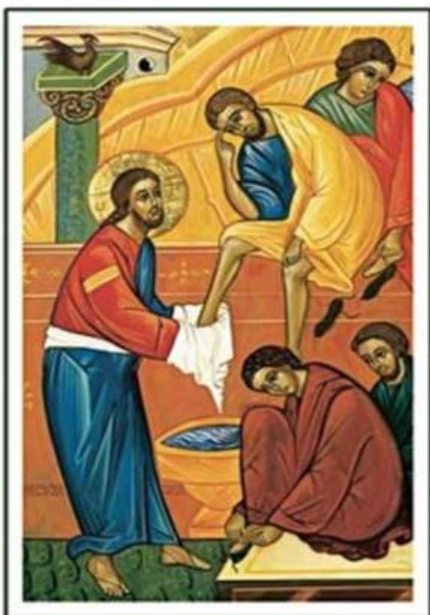

Pentecost Sunday

Pentecost

Pentecost marks the occasion of God sending the Holy Spirit upon Jesus' disciples after his Resurrection. The book of Acts describes how the disciples were gathered together in one place on the day of Pentecost. The Jewish feast of Pentecost (Shavuot or the Feast of Weeks) was a day that commemorated the giving of the law to Moses, a day soon to be marked as well by the giving of the Holy Spirit.

On Pentecost, the Holy Spirit gave the disciples the strength to fulfill their commission to spread the Good News of Jesus. The Solemnity of Pentecost, which crowns and fulfills the Easter season, is a good time to pray for a deeper indwelling of the Holy Spirit.

Prayer to the Holy Spirit

The following prayer was recited by Pope Benedict XVI in a homily on November 7, 2006. This is a prayer to the Holy Spirit.

Let us invoke him
 so that he will irrigate, warm and straighten,
 so that he will pervade us
 with the power of his sacred flame
 and renew the earth.
 Let us pray for his with all our hearts
 at this time, in these days.
Amen.

THE GRACE I SEEK: to be empty of self so that I can be filled with Holy Spirit

IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN.

Pause for a few moments, and allow yourself to become aware of Jesus' gift of himself in the Eucharist. Realize that, at this very moment, the Lord of Life is gazing upon you with great love. Allow yourself to receive his loving gaze. You are his beloved child. Rest in his loving gaze.

Thank Jesus for the gift of himself in the Eucharist.

ASK FOR THE GRACE: Lord, I ask you for the grace to have a Marian heart, ready to welcome the Holy Spirit so that you can dwell within me and guide me to serve my brothers and sisters without counting the cost.

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you through this passage.

"When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the house where they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit." (Acts 2:1–4)

REFLECTION QUESTION — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.

In the midst of the upper room, Our Lady sat among the disciples and with them experienced the powerful overshadowing of the Holy Spirit. And this was not the first time the Spirit of God descended upon her. She is truly a Temple of the Holy Spirit, and she wants to help us! Ask Mary to help you identify ways that you can allow for more space in your mind and heart for the Holy Spirit to guide you. What expectations, ideas, or false conceptions might you be able to leave behind so that, like the Apostles, you can be set on fire with God's love and proclaim the Gospel in new ways?

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Again, allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Let the Holy Spirit speak to you through this passage.

"Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, 'Peace be with you.' When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord." (John 20:19–20)

REFLECTION QUESTION — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.

When Jesus appeared to his Apostles after the Resurrection, he offered them peace, which is a gift of the Holy Spirit. How can I allow God's peace to quiet all the fears about the present and future that are in my heart? Ask Our Lady to help you identify some concrete steps you can take to let the Holy Spirit guide your choices.

Remain in silence with the Lord. Allow him to speak in the silence, in your heart. Receive his presence. If it helps, write down what you sense the Lord communicating to you during this time of prayer.

CLOSING PRAYER — O God, who by the mystery of today's great feast sanctify your whole Church in every people and nation, pour out, we pray, the gifts of the Holy Spirit across the face of the earth and, with the divine grace that was at work when the Gospel was first proclaimed, fill now once more the hearts of believers. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen. (Collect, Pentecost Sunday)

SUNDAY MASS CONNECTION — At every Mass, Jesus offers himself to the Father for us. We can always join our own offerings with Jesus at Mass. This Sunday, offer your desire to be a living temple of the Holy Spirit, allowing Jesus' Spirit to guide you in all things.

LOVE IN ACTION — In a moment when you are tempted to follow self-will, ask for the guidance of the Holy Spirit to help lead you to all that is true, good, and beautiful—not only for your sake but also for the sake of authentically loving the people God has placed in your life.

Reflection on the Readings for Pentecost - May 19, 2024

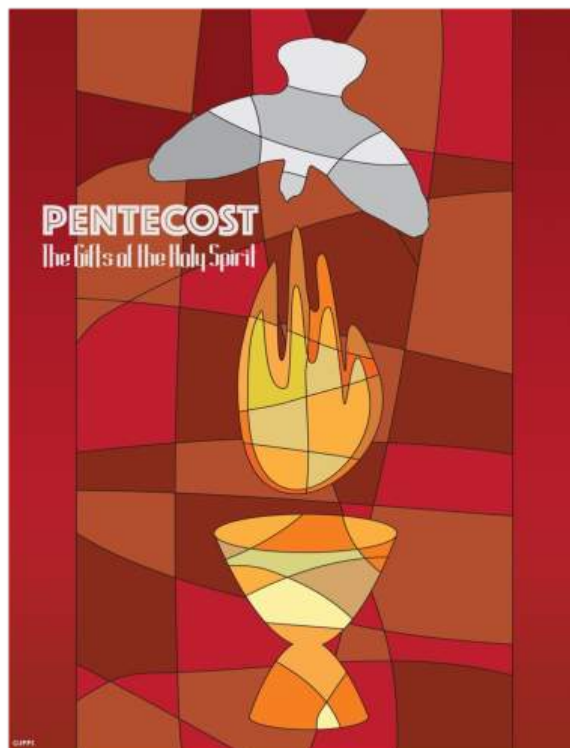
RIGHT RELATIONSHIPS

Fire. It's intense, beautiful, dangerous, overwhelming, warm, and all consuming. Fire can be used to warm us on a cold night, or as a way to gather friends on a summer evening. It can also yield immense destruction. Fire is powerful. This is the image that we hear about today as we learn more about the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles at Pentecost. At our Confirmation, we too receive the gift of the Spirit. But have our hearts been set ablaze like those of the Apostles? Do we radically and unabashedly share Christ with those around us, setting their hearts ablaze, too?

PRAYER

The disciples are paralyzed by fear. They have hidden themselves in a locked room, afraid that they will be put to death for being followers of Christ. Imagine them huddled around the room. What might they have been talking about? They were probably dejected and confused. Their teacher, the man they believed to be God, had been killed. And then Jesus surprises them. He immediately puts their hearts at ease as he says, "Peace be with you." He reveals his wounds and again offers them peace. Place yourself among the disciples in that locked room. What is it like when Jesus first appears? Are you more scared? Confused? What do his hands and feet look like? As he speaks words of peace, how does your heart change? Take some time to be part of this scene. When a phrase or moment strikes you, stop and pray with it.

Jesus breathes his Spirit upon the disciples and sends them out, giving them authority to teach and forgive in his name. You, too, have received the Spirit of Christ through Baptism and Confirmation. Do you shamelessly share Christ with others? Have you heeded the Spirit or ignored his promptings? Commit this week to sharing Christ with someone you meet or already know.



RESOLUTION

Fruits of the Spirit. If we are living in the Spirit, there are certain fruits that will manifest in our lives. Jesus tells us that, "You will know them by their fruits ... every sound tree bears good fruit, but the bad tree bears evil fruit. A sound tree cannot bear evil fruit, nor can a bad tree bear good fruit" (Matthew 7:16–18). If you allow the Holy Spirit to work in your life, you will notice charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, and chastity. Wow! What a plethora of good things! We all long for these in our lives. The key to unlocking them is by living in the Holy Spirit. Welcome him each morning, throughout the day, and in the evening to reign in your heart and guide your actions that day. As you grow closer to him, God will increasingly live through you, and you will notice these wonderful fruits in abundance in your life. formed.org
